

## INSTRUCTIONS TO CONTRIBUTORS

The *Journal for the Study of Food and Society (JSFS)* seeks manuscripts that stimulate interest and research in the social aspects of food and nutrition, including a wide scope of issues such as food policies and programs, hunger, malnutrition, eating behaviors, food habits and practices, dietary change, nutrition, education, nutritional epidemiology, applied nutrition, agricultural development, food production distribution and purchasing, and others.

The JSFS will not review papers that are under consideration for publication elsewhere or whose contents have been substantially published before. Submitted manuscripts should report original work not previously published and not in press or under consideration for publication elsewhere. If accepted for publication in this Journal, the author(s) will not publish it elsewhere in the same form, in English or any other language, without the written consent of the editorial board. Copyright will be held by ASFS.

Manuscripts should be double spaced, use Times New Roman 12-point font, with 1 inch margins, and be created on 8 1/2 x 11" letter size. Manuscript pages should be numbered at the center bottom in the footnote area. Each page should have running header (a shortened version of the article title not more than seven words long) on the top left of each page in the header area.

Contributors may submit their papers in either of two ways. The preferred method is to send the paper electronically via e-mail. The e-mail itself should serve as the submission letter. Attached to the e-mail should be two versions of the paper, *each in a single PDF file*. One of the PDF files should be a complete version of the paper. The cover page of this complete copy of the paper should include all the authors' full names, institutional affiliations and addresses, and the e-mail address of the contact author. The second PDF file should contain an entirely anonymous version of the paper with no author-identifying information. Author-identifying information to be excluded from the anonymous file includes the cover page information on authors, notes of appreciation to others for data or comments on the paper, statements of where the paper may have been presented at a conference, citations to prior scholarship of the author(s) unless they are essential to the literature review of the paper, and any other language that could identify the author(s). Neither PDF copy of the paper should contain author-identifying information in the "document summary" tab of the PDF file. Both should be printable files. An abstract of 150 words or less should be included in both copies of the paper. Authors who state that related text, information on the data, or additional analyses are available on request should include that material in a separate, anonymous PDF file. Alternatively, if PDF is unavailable to the author(s), contributors may submit by emailing the two copies using Word. Papers that do not meet these guidelines will not be sent out for review.

Electronic copies of submitted papers should be sent to the ASFS Editor, Dr. Wm. Alex McIntosh at [w-mcintosh@tamu.edu](mailto:w-mcintosh@tamu.edu). If author is unable to submit electronically, contributors may submit one complete paper copy of the paper and two anonymous paper copies by mail. Paper submissions should be mailed to: Dr. Wm. Alex McIntosh, Department of Rural Sociology, Texas A&M University, 2125 TAMU, College Station, TX 77843-2125. Generally, the ASFS follows the style guidelines of the *American Sociological Association (ASA) Style Guide* (2<sup>nd</sup> edition) and *The Chicago Manual of Style* (14<sup>th</sup> edition) for issues not addressed in the former manual.

Manuscripts will be subject to a blind peer review by members of the ASFS Editorial Board and ad hoc reviewers. Reviewers' comments with a letter of disposition from the editor will be sent to the author(s). The editor may accept or reject a manuscript or, prior to a final decision, request additional information.

Final revisions of accepted manuscripts should be submitted in Word on disk or via e-mail to the ASFS Editor. A hard copy of the manuscripts must be mailed to the ASFS Editor. The name of electronic files should be clearly labeled. Additionally, short bios of all authors are required for accepted manuscripts that includes name, position, department, university, ground mail address, and email address. JSFS reserves the right to make minor stylistic changes that, in the opinion of the editor, do not change the meaning of the, article or the views of the author.

ASFS members, current on dues, will not be charged page costs. Current non-members can avoid page charges by joining the Association for the Study of Food and Society (ASFS). Non-member page costs are \$32.00 per page.
